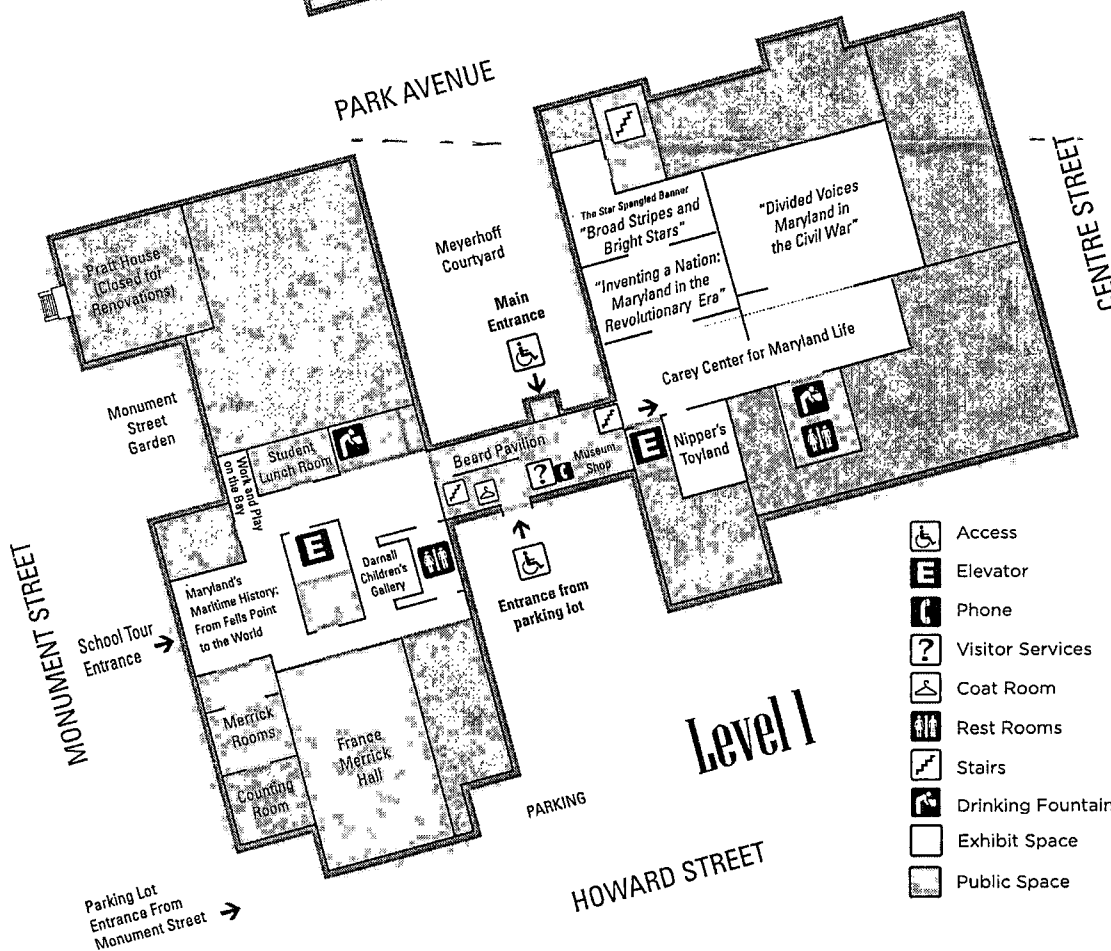
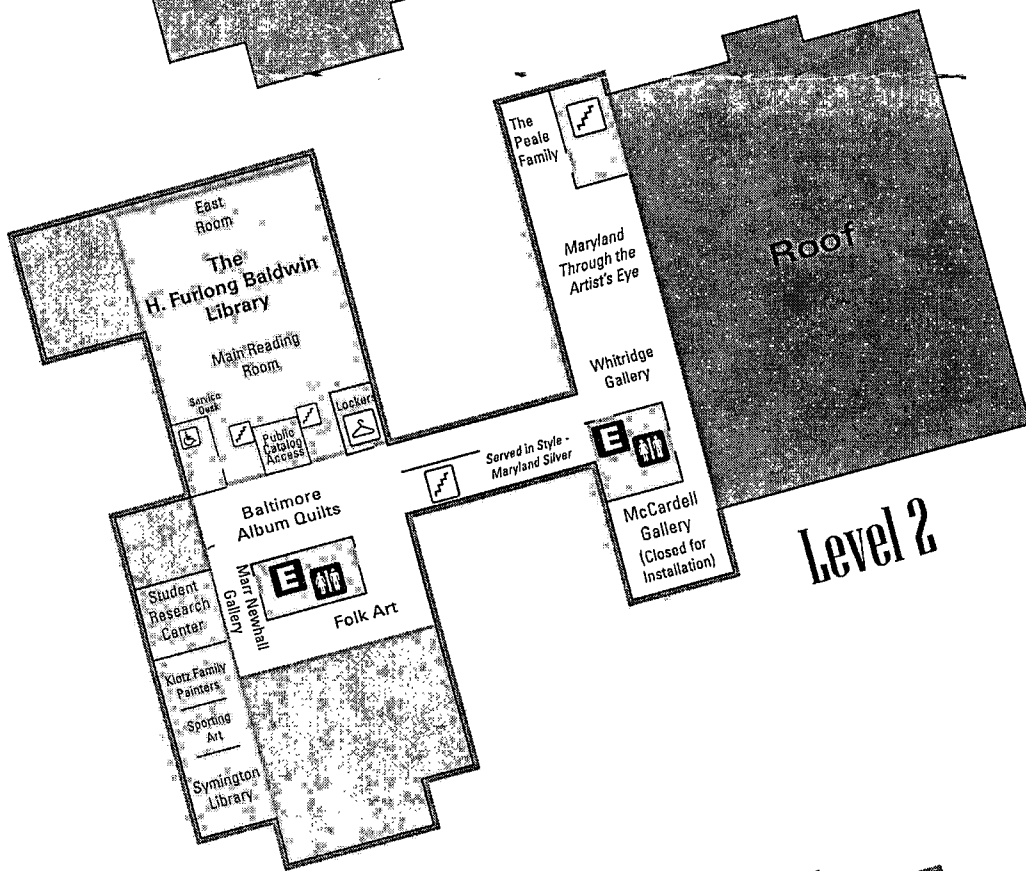
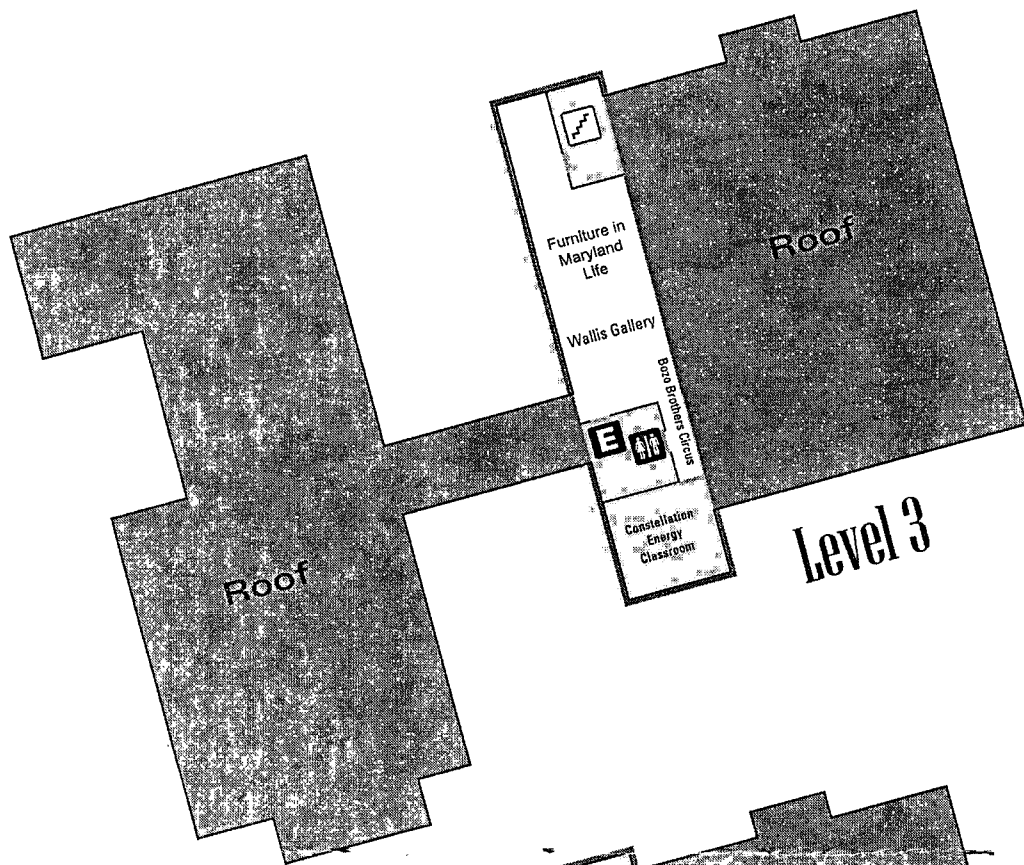

VISITOR GUIDELINES To preserve the collections of the MdHS and ensure the enjoyment and safety of all our visitors, the following items may not be brought into the museum or library:

- Backpacks
- Hand-carried bags or items larger than 9" X 12"
- Infant backpacks (Strollers are permitted.)
- Food and beverages
- Umbrellas
- Animals (except recognized assistance animals)
- Tripods and easels

COATROOM Coat racks and umbrella stands are available near the Visitor Services Desk and near the 2nd floor library entrance. Lockers are available on the main level and in the library. Backpacks or other items not permitted in the exhibit space may be held at the Visitor Services desk.

CHILDREN AND FAMILIES Children are encouraged to play gently with toys and activities distributed among several exhibits. Look for locations in Looking for Liberty, Nippers Toyland and Maryland Maritime History. **PLEASE NOTE:** Children under 13 may not be left unsupervised in the museum.

RESTROOMS are located on all three levels of the Museum and in the Library.
